## SPOTLIGHT ON CASWA

We are currently supporting 74 women and 44 children & young people. During the period of September-November, we received 28 referrals to our service. More information about our service can be found on our website

Back to School! - Schools returned in August and our Children & Young People's Team were busy in anticipation throughout August & September. Our team helped families prepare for the return to school by providing "back to school" vouchers (funded by a grant from STV Children's Appeal) to help families purchase school bags, stationary, etc required for school. Our team also worked hard to create new materials (posters and a video) which went out electronically to all primary and secondary schools in Caithness and Sutherland to raise awareness of the impact of domestic abuse on children and young people during lockdown as well as to highlight the work that we do in our Children & Young People's Service. The team spent a lot of time developing robust risk assessments and worked closely and carefully alongside schools to enable a return to face-to-face support for children and young people who have experienced domestic abuse. A busy few months for our Children & Young People's Team!

Awareness Raising - We have spent the past few months consistently promoting the message #wearestillhere (if you haven't seen our video yet: click here). Like everyone, we have become used to virtual meetings and we spent time in October developing and adapting our awareness raising sessions and workshops to make them available remotely/virtually. Partner Agency Feedback - We work in partnership with a number of agencies and groups throughout Caithness and Sutherland as a core and important part of our working practice. In September, we contacted partner agencies and invited them to complete a questionnaire about our service. The feedback received evidenced our effective multi-agency working and helped us to put plans in place for 2021.

#ChangeHerStory Campaign - We teamed up with 13 agencies to develop a Highland-wide campaign, #ChangeHerStory. The campaign takes place for the duration of 16 days (25th Nov-10th Dec) - the internationally recognised period for activism against gender-based violence. The campaign will feature daily posts from campaign partners (we are scheduled to post on 9th December) as well as an invitation to the community to take part by sharing what they would like to see change for women and girls. - 2020 is our 15 year anniversary. We had so many plans for the year which sadly had to be cancelled.
